The Pastor's Pen

"God Be With Ye"

There is recorded in Acts chapter 20 the account of the Apostle Paul encouraging, admonishing, and strengthening the elders of the church in Ephesus as he prepares to leave them for the last time. The passage is deeply poignant, and the reader can readily sense the sadness, yet hopefulness, with which Paul says goodbye.

Paul says to his friends, "Keep watch over yourselves and over all the flock, of which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to shepherd the church of God that he obtained with the blood of his own Son." Then, a few verses later, "And now I commend you to God and to the message of his grace, a message that is able to build you up and to give you the inheritance among all who are sanctified."

It is with this very same sadness, yet hopefulness, that Nancy and I leave you. You are a blessed church of the living Christ. You have achieved much, and much more is in store for you, as you remain faithful to the Son of God. I would offer the following encouragement to you, in the manner of Paul.

- ◇ Remember to love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, strength, and mind, and your neighbors as yourself. (Luke 10:27)
- ◇ Remember the CPC mission statement: "To invite people to experience Jesus Christ and to become his joyful disciples."
- ◇ Grasp every opportunity to grow in Christ, and especially through the disciplines that the Acts 16:5 initiative is going to offer you in the years to come.
- ◇ Remember that it is up to you: Shall the Community Presbyterian Church of Cedar City be a cruise ship, or a rescue boat?

Our word "goodbye" is, of course, a contraction of an ancient blessing, "God be with ye." You and this faithful church of the living Christ will continue to be lifted in my prayers.

Provisional Sunday Schedule!

Beginning Sunday, January 5 and until further notice, Community Presbyterian Church will worship at a single 10:00 am service. The Session approved this change in order to simply worship logistics in the absence of a pastor.

The worship schedule will be revisited when an interim pastor is in place. The process of finding God's choice for the interim pastor will take at least a few months. (Pray for that process!)

The Lord's Supper will be celebrated every Sunday during the provisional period. Music during the provisional period will include primarily traditional hymns with occasional praise songs. The schedules for children's and youth activities will be adjusted accordingly. Look for information right away regarding provisional changes to these Sunday schedules.

Questions about the provisional Sunday schedule may be addressed to any member of the Session. Klaus Stetzenbach is the Ruling Elder over the Worship Committee.

Annual Meeting January 26, 2014

The annual stated meeting of Community Presbyterian Church is set for Sunday, January 26 following worship at 10:00 am. On the agenda:

- † 2013 reports of Session committees, Deacons, Community Presbyterian Women, and others

Your Session at Work!

The Session of Community Presbyterian Church met on December 17, 2013 for its monthly stated meeting. At that meeting the Session...

- ◇ Heard from the Rev. Jeff Silliman, Moderator of the Committee on Ministry of the Presbytery of Utah. Jeff discussed details of the pastoral transition process, and support that will be available from the Committee on Ministry.
- ◇ Approved motions from the Youth Committee (Rita Osborn) for the youth to offer an enchilada dinner fundraiser on March 29, and for the annual flamingo fundraiser from January through March
- ◇ Approved a motion from the Worship Committee (Klaus Stetzenbach) to begin a provisional Sunday schedule, with one service of worship at 10:00 am, at least until such time when an interim pastor is in place. Communion will be celebrated each Sunday in the provisional period.
- ◇ Approved a motion from the Worship Committee which provides financial compensation for CPC members who preach and lead worship, effective immediately and indefinitely (extending beyond the current interim period)
- ◇ Heard the report of the Stewardship Committee (John Guthrie) regarding the current state of financial pledges received for 2014. As of December 17, 77 pledges had been received for a total of \$148,942. Roughly \$21,000 in pledges are outstanding, if about fourteen CPC families pledge the same as they did for 2013.
- ◇ Heard a report on the most recent Acts 16:5 Initiative workshop, held in Salt Lake City on December 11 (Dana Covey).
- ◇ Set the date for the 2014 annual stated meeting of the congregation to be January 26.
- ◇ Acted to suspend emergency assistance for community members until an interim pastor is in place.
- ◇ Acted to continue emergency assistance for

CPC members and friends, using the current request review committee (Shari Hughes and Letha Houts).

- ◇ Heard from the Finance Committee (Rick Osborn) regarding the current state of church finances. For the month of November, expenses exceeded income by \$14,541.16.
- ◇ Approved a revised 2014 draft budget proposed by the Finance Committee. The revised budget estimates 2014 expenses to be \$200,850, vs. \$232,400 for 2013. Substantial savings are recognized by the absence of the pastor's salary and benefits for some part of the year.
- ◇ Heard from the Nominating Committee (Klaus Stetzenbach) that two needed Ruling Elder nominees have been identified (Mary Belle Royer and Fred Hite) and that two needed Deacon nominees have been identified (Becky Hill and Linda Ahlstrom)

Stewardship 2013 Update

The theme for the 2013 stewardship season was *"Your Treasure, Your Heart,"* based on Matthew 6:21. The Stewardship Committee for 2013 consists of Dave Miller, Patt Behrens, and John Guthrie (Moderator).

As of December 17, 2013 77 pledges of financial giving have been received for a total of \$148,942. This figure should be compared to \$169,638 (76 pledges) for 2013 and \$185,327 (84 pledges) for 2012.

It is clear from comparing pledges for 2013 and 2014 that there are some \$21,000 in remaining pledges that could be realized if some fourteen families would simply meet their pledge from last year.

The 2013 Stewardship Committee encourages every CPC member and friend family to pledge. Remember always that your pledge is to God, and your giving is to God. We are called to give of our first fruits, not the leftovers (as Laura Stellmon reminded us on November 10).

Thank you for your pledge of giving for 2014!

The Christmas Season and Epiphany

Most people think of the Christmas Season as the period between Thanksgiving and Christmas Day, but for Christians that period is (roughly) the Advent Season. The Christmas Season actually begins on Christmas Day and extends for the twelve days following

On the thirteenth day the church celebrates the Day of Epiphany. "Epiphany" is related to a Greek word meaning "manifestation" or "revelation." On the Day of Epiphany the church celebrates the revelation of God to humanity in Christ, who became human for us, and especially that revelation to the Gentiles, that is, non-Jews. That's why the Day of Epiphany generally includes references to the visit of the magi or wise men to Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, because the wise men were, of course, Gentiles. The Day of Epiphany is always January 6.

The liturgical color for the Season of Christmas is white, so you will see white everywhere in the Sanctuary during this season.

Thus we are now in the Season of Christmas! Celebrate the birth of Christ! The Messiah has come!

Health Advice From the Parish Nurse

Hypothermia

Hypothermia occurs when the body temperature decreases to 94 degrees or less. Internal organs begin to function poorly, and messages travel more slowly from the brain to the rest of the nervous system. Heart arrhythmias may occur. The heart slows and blood pressure falls.

Symptoms increase gradually in severity and can sometimes escape detection until the situation is critical. A person may at first feel cold and then start to shiver. However, when the body temperature reaches 94 degrees, the sensation of cold is lost, and shivering usually stops. Bodily movement becomes slow and clumsy. Speech is thick and slow, and thinking becomes impaired.

Prevention of hypothermia includes maintaining a warm environment, wearing layers of clothing, drinking warm fluids, avoiding alcoholic beverages (as alcohol dilates blood vessels), and exercising to increase the body's production of heat.

The first goal with suspected hypothermia is to keep the victim warm and dry. The person should be handled gently and kept as still as possible since sudden movements can produce abnormal heart rhythms, which can pump cold blood back to the heart. Emergency services are needed to warm the person and monitor for arrhythmias and dehydration.

Update on the Acts 16:5 Initiative

“Day after day the congregations became stronger in faith and larger in size.” (Acts 16:5, *The Message* version)

The *Acts 16:5 Initiative* is a deliberate program intended to renew particular churches (like Community Presbyterian) and to help them grow in faith and numbers...just like the passage reads! *Acts 16:5* is an initiative designed and provided by the *Vital Churches Institute* (<http://www.vitalchurchesinstitute.com/>), which is an educational and consulting organization devoted to renewal and revitalization for Christ's church.

The *Vital Churches Institute* provides support for participating churches for three years, and then the churches carry on with the transformative process on their own steam.

The Acts 16:5 Vision Team for Community Presbyterian Church (Pastor John, Janet Ackart, and Dana Covey) attended on December 11, 2013 the first of six planned workshops to be offered by the *Vital Churches Institute* over the next three years. The presenter for the workshop was the Rev. Stanley Ott, the primary consultant for the institute.

Stan reminded the workshop attendees (members of Vision Teams from ten churches in the Presbytery of Utah) of the core tenet of Acts 16:5:

“We must be the people of God before we can do the work of the people of God.”

Acts 16:5 facilitates and requires congregational renewal, reinvigoration, and spiritual growth. In the immediate future for Community Presbyterian Church, look for at least two means of this renewal:

- ◇ **Word-Share-Prayer.** Word-Share-Prayer is a brief devotional exercise that can be practiced every time a CPC small group gathers for a meeting or other activity. The exercise involves study of a passage of scripture, sharing insights on that passage, collecting prayer requests, and praying simply for those requests. Look for the use of Word-Share-Prayer exercises in more and more small group meetings.
- ◇ **Intentional Discipleship Small Groups.** The Acts 16:5 Vision Team will be working to start and support new intentional small groups whose purpose is growth in personal discipleship for members of these groups. The groups will require high commitment, and will meet weekly.

Other components of the transformation process will be implemented over the coming weeks and months. Watch what God will do through the Acts 16:5 Initiative! This is an exciting time for Community Presbyterian Church!


