The Pastor's Pen

"Agape, Again"

Scripture makes it pretty clear.

"I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." (John 13:34-35, Jesus speaking)

If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing. Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends. (1 Corinthians 13:1-8a)

God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them. Love has been perfected among us in this: that we may have boldness on the day of judgment, because as he is, so are we in this world. There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear; for fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not reached perfection in love. We love because he first loved us. Those who say, 'I love God', and hate their brothers or sisters, are liars; for those who do not love a brother or sister whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen. The commandment we have from him is this: those who love God must love their brothers and sisters also. (1 John 4:16b-21)

If we fail to love one another in word and deed, we are no longer the church of Christ. Self-giving, self-sacrificing love ("agape" in Greek) is fundamental to our lives in Christ, and to our lives together as Community Presbyterian Church. "Agape" love is not optional for those who call Jesus Lord.

Over the past several months the Session has been in conversation with CCES leaders to see if God might be calling us to host their congregation in our building. The essential needs of CCES are space for worship and fellowship on Sunday, Wednesday, and Saturday evenings.

Since June 2 the Session has been receiving questions and comments regarding the possible hosting of CCES from CPC members and friends, and a number of them have been received. You may still speak with a ruling elder or the pastor through July 16, or send an email, if you have questions or opinions on the possible hosting arrangement. Informational brochures about CCES are available in the Narthex, on the church website, or by mail (on request).

At the stated Session meeting on Tuesday, July 16, the Session will prayerfully make a decision on proceeding with the arrangement, or not. Your prayers for discernment are gratefully appreciated.

Your Session at Work!

The Session of Community Presbyterian Church met on June 18 for its monthly stated meeting. At that meeting the Session...

- ◇ On recommendation from the Finance Committee (Alan Calliham) approved the treasurer's report for the month of May 2013
- ◇ Heard from the Worship Committee (Klaus Stetzenbach) regarding an Internet survey currently underway to assess how much difficulty CPC worshipers have hearing in the sanctuary; reported that gluten free bread is now available for all celebrations of the Lord's Supper; reported on initial discussions towards a single service of worship during the summer of 2014
- ◇ On recommendation from the Worship Committee approved Amarante Vasquez and Ruth Kinney to preach and lead worship on July 30 and August 7, respectively, in the absence of the pastor
- ◇ Heard from the Property and Maintenance Committee (Amarante Vasquez) about recent property issues: the Community Presbyterian Women have recently deep-cleaned the kitchen; a ceiling fan will be installed in the library; the lawn sprinkler system has been repaired and adjusted; the Grow-N-Share Garden will not be tended this summer due to a lack of volunteers; initial plans for renovating the kitchen counters and floors.
- ◇ Approved a motion from the P&M Committee to spend up to \$3,000 from the Day Care Fund to paint and carpet the 3/4 elementary classroom.
- ◇ Heard from the Church Life Committee (Julie Dempsey) that the recent all church bowling event went very well; plans for the annual Independence Day All Church Barbeque are still in formation; the annual All Church Campout is set for August 2-4.
- ◇ Heard from the Mission Committee (Jan Ackart) that the USDA summer lunch program is running well; the planned mission trip to Mora, New Mexico needs more workers.
- ◇ Heard from the Personnel Committee (Neal Smith) regarding committee discussion on optimal timing for employee reviews; the committee is committed to produce a draft policies and procedures manual for the church
- ◇ Considered a proposed policy on sick leave and vacation for CPC staff from the Personnel

Committee; recommended some modifications to the proposal

- ◇ Heard from the Children's Ministries Committee (Lynne Brown) that a summer Vacation Bible School is still possible, if a collaboration can be worked out with the Cedar True Life Center
- ◇ Heard from the Youth Ministries Committee (Pastor Guthrie for Rita Osborn) that youth programs continue strongly for the summer; Youth Director Penny Yardley continues to spend many hours coordinating the Utah Presbytery contingent to Presbyterian Youth Triennium, July 16-21 on the Purdue University campus.
- ◇ Began the process of reviewing the membership rolls. Pastor Guthrie will send letters to selected individuals asking if they wish to maintain their membership with CPC.
- ◇ Voted unanimously to participate in Acts 16:5, a church transformation initiative which requires commitment from at least 10 churches within Utah Presbytery
- ◇ Discussed comments and questions received thus far regarding the possible host arrangement between Community Presbyterian and Centro Cristiano El Shaddai






Widows Support Group

Health Advice from the Parish Nurse

Hiccups are a movement disorder. Almost everyone has had hiccups at one time or another. Hiccups occur when the diaphragm spasms. Hiccups are followed by quick, noisy closings of the glottis. Hiccups are not life threatening, but they are annoying.

Hiccups usually have no obvious cause. They can be triggered by laughing, talking, eating, or drinking. Sometimes pneumonia, a stroke, or abdominal surgery may cause hiccups. Hiccups usually begin suddenly and stop after several seconds or minutes. They can persist for a longer time.

The simplest way to cure hiccups is to hold one's breath. Other methods are breathing into a paper bag, drinking water quickly, or swallowing dry bread or crushed ice. If hiccups persist and the cause cannot be corrected, some drugs may be effective, such as, scopolamine, prochlorperazine, chlorpromazine, baclofen, metoclopramide, and valproate.


