The Pastor's Pen

"Now What?"

For those Christian traditions that pay attention to the ancient rhythm of the liturgical (church) calendar (such as the Presbyterian churches), we have just finished a long but moving journey through a number of prominent themes, with concomitant emotions, that span a period of some fourteen weeks or so.

Roughly speaking, that period is known as Lent-Easter, which begins, of course, on Ash Wednesday (which occurred on February 13). Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Season of Lent, which is 40 days (not counting Sundays) before Easter Sunday. As we noted throughout the season, Lent reminds us of our brokenness, our fallen-ness, our sinfulness, in the presence of a holy God. We are invited to meditate and pray on these things, and to approach the depth of what Christ has done for us on the cross. At the end of Lent we observed Maundy Thursday and Good Friday (March 28-29).

On Resurrection Sunday (March 31) we celebrated the victory of God over sin and death, in the amazing resurrection of Christ from his grave. Thus began the fifty-day Season of Easter, which included seven Sundays. The theme of God's grace, love, and providence fills those fifty days. At the end of those days we celebrated Pentecost Sunday (June 19), recalling the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the ragtag band of disciples on the same day, some fifty days after Jesus was raised. Finally we celebrated Trinity Sunday (June 26), the only liturgical calendar day centered on a doctrine of the church.

After Trinity Sunday we launch into Ordinary Time, so named because the Sundays are numbered (as in the "ordinal numbers" you may recall from mathematics). Thus the first Sunday after Trinity Sunday this year (June 2) is called "The Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time." What do we do in ordinary time? The color of this period is green, reminding us that Ordinary Time is a time for growing in Christ. During this period, from June 2 to Christ the King Sunday, November 24, we are to be about the business of growing in Christ.

Growing in Christ (discipleship) is not a no-cost enterprise. It is costly. It requires commitment. It requires commitment to the living Christ. It requires sacrifice, a word that most 21st century folks would rather avoid. Discipleship requires discipline. Discipline in worship attendance, in study, in prayer, in service to others, in giving. It requires picking up one's cross and carrying it, daily. It requires the consistent practice of "being last."

What do we do during Ordinary Time? That's what.

May God bless your 2013 "ordinary time," and may you become even more "sold out" to the living Christ, as the result of passing through it.

Your Session at Work!

The Session of Community Presbyterian Church met on May 21 for its monthly stated meeting. At that meeting the Session...

- ◊Reviewed potential changes to the pastor's insurance premiums for the year 2014
- ◊Received the report of the Spring 2013 meeting of Utah Presbytery from ruling elder Amarante Vasquez
- ◊Received the report of the Mission Council (Jan Ackart, in absentia), which included a donation to the Las Vegas Rescue Mission, continuing plans for the summer mission trip to Mora, New Mexico, and continuing evaluation of CPC's participation in the Living Waters for the World mission
- ◊Received the report of the Children's Ministry Committee (Lynne Brown, in absentia) regarding tentative new plans for Vacation Bible School 2013 (including a possible joint effort with True Life Center)
- ◊Received the report of the Property & Maintenance Committee (Amarante Vasquez) which included ongoing routine maintenance, plans for carpet and paint in the 3rd/4th grade classroom, continuing review of janitorial services, and a landscape maintenance report
- ◊Received the report of the Finance Committee (Alan Calliham), which indicates that finances are in good shape at this point in the year; the receipts over expenses balance sits at \$3,338.25 as of the end of April
- ◊Received the report of the Worship Committee (Klaus Stetzenbach), which included a review of Pentecost 2013, the offering of gluten-free bread for Communion at both services in the future, and a request for a new bid on sanctuary upgrades
- ◊Approved two new proposals for adult studies, one on "The Holy Trinity" to be led by deacon Robert Hughes, and one on the book of *Romans*, led by the pastor
- ◊Approved the pastor's vacation request for June 25 to July 8
- ◊Received a report from the pastor on the proposed participation of Community

Presbyterian Church in the Acts 16:5 initiative, which is under consideration by a number of churches within the Presbytery of Utah, and set a special meeting for June 2 to hear more about the initiative



Stewardship Musings

One well-known church consultant writes periodically in his email communications about the difference between "charitable giving" and "harvest giving." Charitable giving donors use their disposable income to support causes that they deem to be "worthy." For these givers, their church is placed alongside museums, schools, and causes that directly serve the needs of those in need. Charitable giving, this consultant says, feels good because it perpetuates the illusion of "having earned it, I choose how to give it."

Harvest giving, on the other hand, acknowledges the living God as Lord of the harvest, the One who gives all good things. Those who harvest more have two fundamental obligations, to thank God for God's providence, and to share that harvest with those who have not been so deeply blessed. Harvest givers give, in the Biblical model, a percentage of their increase for the year, and do so with thanksgiving for God's great benefits. Harvest givers give "off the top" and not "what's left over." Harvest givers grasp what God has done for them in Christ, and can respond in no other way than by returning what is already God's, with generosity.

Thus, giving to one's church is fundamentally different from giving to charitable causes.

Health Advice from the Parish Nurse

Tinnitus

Tinnitus is apparent noise originating in the ear rather than the environment. It is common and affects 15% of people over 45 and 25% of people over 65. Hearing loss is the most common cause of tinnitus. Accumulated earwax, Meniere's disease, fluid in the middle ear, and acoustic neuroma are other causes. Other disorders that can cause tinnitus are anemia, hardening of the arteries, and heart murmurs. High doses of aspirin can also cause tinnitus.

Tinnitus yields noises sounding like bells, crickets, ringing, buzzing, roaring, whistling, or hissing. If the cause is not clear, hearing tests, MRI's, CT's, ultrasounds, or blood tests may be performed.

If a cause is found, most tinnitus can be relieved. If it is due to hearing loss, a hearing aid will help. A white-noise generator may help those who have trouble sleeping due to tinnitus.

Coffee Fellowship






