The Pastor's Pen

"The Great Commission"

Jesus came and said to them [his disciples], "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." Matthew 28:18-20.

I am constantly reminded of this passage at the very end of Matthew's gospel. As much as I would like to do so, I cannot escape its imperatives. It is with me constantly.

The four imperatives (Go, Make disciples, Baptize them, Teach them) are explicit. They are often called "The Great Commission," and were popularized with that name by Rick Warren of *The Purpose Driven Life* and *The Purpose Driven Church* fame.

We Presbyterians have, for both theological and less noble reasons, often neglected our allegiance to The Great Commission. But there it is. Always before us. Always with us.

And why not? When we have the greatest story in the world to tell, why would we want to keep it to ourselves? When we have ourselves experienced the overwhelming joy of being claimed by the living Christ, why would we keep it to ourselves? When we have ourselves found the peace of living in, for, and with him, why would we keep that to ourselves? These are the reasons we evangelize. These are the reasons we learn to share our own stories, our own witness, of our experience with Christ. So that others may, by our testimony, be drawn into his loving embrace as well.

Dear friends in Christ, go and make disciples, by the love and power of the Holy Spirit. Simply share your own testimony. And remember that Christ is with you always, even to the end of the age.

Approved the March financial report from the Treasurer

Heard from the Church Life Committee (Julie Dempsey) that the "Spring Fling" all church potluck dinner (with new member welcome) on April 6 went very well

Heard from the Church Life Committee that the next church fellowship event will be the annual All Church Picnic on Sunday, May 19

Approved a motion from the Mission Committee (Jan Ackart) to sell or donate the old kitchen freezer

Approved a motion from the Mission Committee to schedule a mission trip to the Las Vegas Rescue Mission for October, 2013

Approved a motion from the Mission Committee to organize a mission trip to Mora, NM July 27 to August 3, 2013

Approved a motion from the Mission Committee to assemble "Gifts of the Heart" school kits for children in need for the coming school year

Approved a motion from the Mission Committee to sell Equal Exchange products at the Ten Thousand Villages sale set for November 2013

Approved a motion from the Mission Committee to have a Compassion International information Sunday on April 12, 2013

Heard from the Property & Maintenance Committee (Amarante Vasquez) that: light replacement throughout the building continues; appropriate measures are underway to improve janitorial service; improved ceiling insulation is planned; repair of cracks and painting in the sanctuary has been relayed for consideration to the Vision Steering Committee; a temporary storage container for rummage goods will be located on the SW side of the parking lot; P&M has considered some options with respect to storage of musical instruments for Centro Cristiano El

Shaddai, should CCES eventually be hosted by CPC; the Grow-N-Share Garden will be supervised by Debbie Vogel and Sue Ebersole beginning in May 2013

Heard from the Property & Maintenance Committee that a new division of responsibilities has been instituted, with the members of the committee taking charge of various aspects of facility maintenance and repair

Heard from the Worship Committee (Klaus Stetzenbach) that foot washing at the Maundy Thursday service was well received, although attendance was low compared to recent years

Heard from the Worship Committee that scripture will again be read in different languages on Pentecost Sunday, May 19

Heard from the Youth Ministries Committee (Rita Osborn) that four CPC youth are planning to attend Presbyterian Youth Triennium July 16-21 at Purdue University; seven youth participated in the 2013 30 Hour Famine, April 12-13; summer events for youth will not be as regular as the school year, but will certainly continue

Heard from the Children's Ministry Committee (Lynne Brown) that the youth group from Wyoming that was scheduled to lead CPC's Vacation Bible School 2013 will not be able to come. VBS is currently scheduled for June 10-14. Lynne will go to work on an alternative plan.

Heard from Children's Ministries that high school and college graduates will be recognized before worship some Sunday soon.

Heard from the Evangelism Committee (John Guthrie) that visitor contacts, notes, phone calls, bread deliveries, continue.

Approved a motion expressing the session's intention to move forward with the plan for hosting Centro Cristiano El Shaddai (a local Spanish-speaking congregation). The next step is to seek congregational feedback on the proposal.

Health Advice from the Parish Nurse

Compression Fractures of the Spine

With osteoporosis the bones of the spine may collapse and become compressed. Osteoporosis causes less dense and weaker bones. This condition in turn can cause fractures from only slight force, such as turning, bending, or standing. Sometimes fractures can occur for no reason. Most vertebral compression fractures occur in the middle to lower back.

Vertebral compression fractures may cause sudden, sharp pain or no pain when they occur. Sometimes pain occurs gradually. If someone has many vertebral fractures, she can lose height, and the back may become rounded and bent. Compression fractures rarely damage the spinal cord or nerves, but if they do, symptoms include weakness in the legs, numbness, paralysis, and fecal or urinary incontinence.

Treatment is intended primarily to relieve pain. Sometimes a back brace may make walking less painful. A few days of bed rest may relieve pain, but walking as soon as possible can help with a quicker recovery. Walking helps prevent loss of muscle tone and prevents additional loss of bone density. Physical therapy can strengthen muscles and help with walking. Most compression fractures will eventually heal without major medical intervention.

The deacons continue their monthly endeavors to be in touch with their assigned families by phone, email, or card. Pastor John greatly appreciates their efforts to touch our families monthly.


“Meet Your Deacon Sunday” on April 14 was a terrific opportunity for the deacons to meet (or greet) their assigned families.

Compassion Sunday

“The King will reply, ‘I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me.’” Matthew 25: 40.

Perhaps you are already familiar with Compassion International. Perhaps some lucky child has known the blessing of your sponsorship. Perhaps you know that a number of children have been sponsored by various groups within Community Presbyterian Church.

Did you know that Compassion International exists as a Christian child advocacy ministry that releases children from spiritual, economic, social and physical poverty and enables them to become responsible, fulfilled Christian adults? Founded by the Rev. Everett Swanson in 1952, Compassion began providing Korean War orphans with food, shelter, education and health care, as well as Christian education.

Did you know that Compassion takes stewardship seriously? More than 80% of all expenditures go to program activities for their children.

Did you know that 22,000 children die each day due to conditions of poverty? Today Compassion helps more than 1.2 million children in 26 countries.

Each spring, Compassion International asks all of their child sponsor organizations to host a Compassion Sunday. Community Presbyterian will recognize Compassion Sunday in May. Living Waters for the World



Living Waters for the World (LWW),

a mission resource of the Synod of Living Waters of the Presbyterian Church (USA), trains and equips mission teams to share the gift of clean, sustainable water with communities in need. LWW water treatment systems and related educational programs fill a critical niche in the world water crisis - communities with available but contaminated water. LWW welcomes churches of all denominations and also civic organizations to participate with us in this life-changing work.

Since its inception, LWW has partnered with mission teams to empower local community leaders to install and operate over 400 clean-water systems in major developing areas of the world, and in 2005 it expanded its mission to address water quality issues in the Appalachian Region of the United States.

Developing strong partnerships between trained mission teams and community leaders to install and operate clean water systems and working via those partnerships to provide health, hygiene and spiritual education are the key reasons this mission has succeeded.
